Shane's life changed in an instant. He was homeless, struggling with drug abuse. He'd spent a year living out of his car, never knowing where his next meal would come from.

A Life Transformed After 20 Years on the Street

Marcus had been suffering from diabetes and a severe foot infection. We immediately got him the medical care he needed. And when his health stabilized, he entered the Recovery Program, one of the Bridge to Life programs.

"We don't always know why someone hits rock bottom," Erin Goodin, City Rescue Mission President and CEO, says. "What we do know is they come to the right place here, where we can change lives with meals."

Surrounded by kind-hearted people and having his basic needs met for the first time in decades, Marcus began to heal, and let God begin to work in him — work that continues today.
